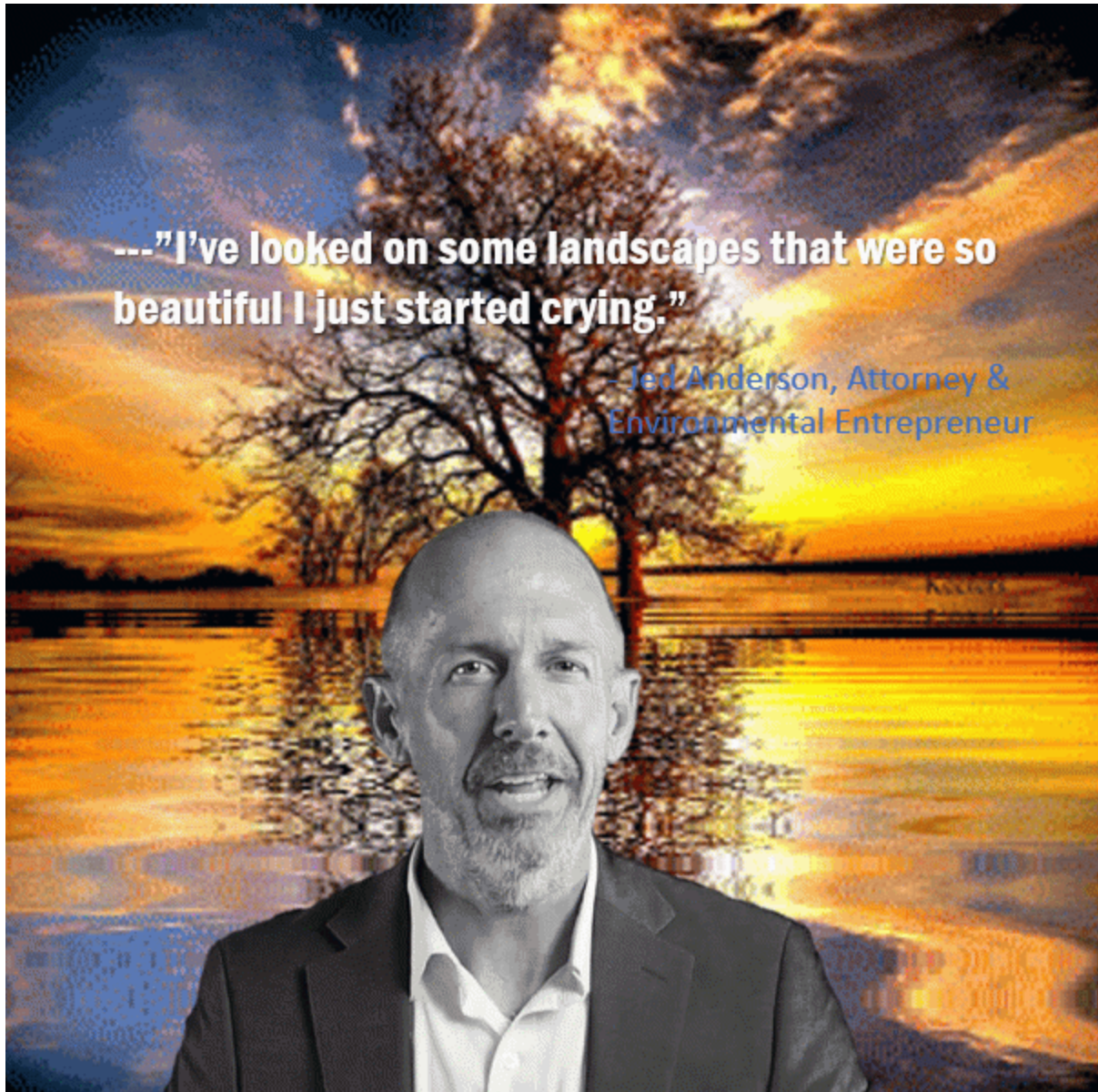

HAVE COURAGE. ALL IS WELL.

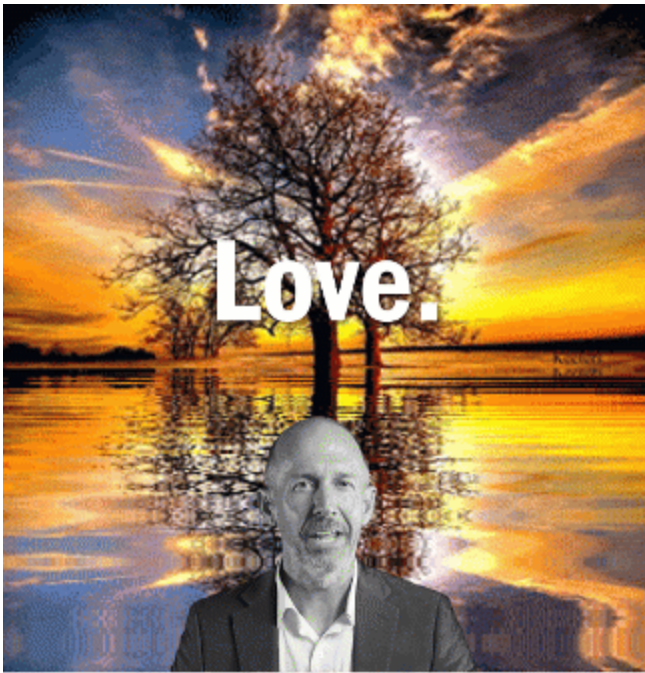
